About the Course

This Certificate IV in English Proficiency provides English language skills to those from a non English speaking background. This courses covers the four macro skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing.

Knowledge and awareness of Australian cultural and societal attributes, issues and values is also provided.

This course is delivered face-to-face and includes group work, individual coursework, role plays and real-world scenarios.

Certificate IV in English Proficiency delivers:

- Pre-course and post-course Compass Literacy and Numeracy Assessment to determine applicants English level.
- Year 12 base level English language and literacy skills.
- Ongoing assessment of students English skills using ACSF.
- Knowledge of Australian culture and society.
- Job seeking skills, Australian workplace etiquette and expectations.
- Employability and soft skills.
- Information sessions conducted by other RTOs on further training options. Students may choose to enrol in further training in an industry or sector of their choice, such as:
 - Nursing, Aged Care, Disability and Community Services,
 - Retail,
 - Hospitality,
 - Transport and Logistics,
 - Construction, Engineering and Electrical.

Important Information

- Applicants will be interviewed to determine training needs and will be required to undertake the Compass literacy assessment.
- Students must attend **a minimum of 80%** of all classes.
- You will be expected to complete workbooks and will be expected to complete homework and practice your English outside of class time.
