SKILLS COVERED

You will learn technical floristry skills: basic & contemporary arrangements for all occasions, ranges of hand tied bouquets, basic wiring work, commercial floristry with an emphasis on speed, artistic designs, visual merchandising, colour theory and application for florists, flower care, basic botanical knowledge. You will also learn a wide range of essential retail skills that will qualify you for the retail sector.

WORK PLACEMENT & ASSESSMENT

Work placement is a mandatory component of this course. Placement develops practical skills, provides an insight into particular roles and is where your workplace competencies can be assessed. Placements can be paid work if relevant to course competency outcomes.

EXPECTED EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

This Floristry course provides graduates with the skills and knowledge to pursue a career in the floristry or retail industry. These courses are for those individuals who want accreditation as a Florist/Florists Assistant. This course will enhance work opportunities within the retail industry.
